

CATTERLEN PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES. 91#

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A Meeting of the above Council took place on 23rd October 2024 at 7.30 p.m. in the Village Hall. Newton Reigny.

PRESENT. Councillors. A. Blackburn (chairman) : J. Elliott : K. Monaghan : D. Bell : D. Booker : W.&F.C Councillor. C. Atkinson. Mr Craig Wright. and the clerk. F. P. Barbour.

MINUTES of the last Meeting were approved and signed by Chairman A. Blackburn.

MATTERS ARISING. It was agreed to engage Community Heartbeat Co. to install a difibrillator in the redundant phone kiosk in Newton Reigny. Village Entrance Gate replacement it was agreed to research possible materials and colour before making a final decision. Repairs to Newton SID the results of a speed check carried out between dates 25th. To 31st. July 2024 showed 6592 vehicles travelled through the village of which 438 exceeded the ACPO limit. Proving that 85% percentile speed was below 32.2 mph which is fine for a 30 mph speed limit. Regarded as fine for a 30mph speed limit. It was agreed continue the dialog with W.&F Highways with regard to this matter.

CASUAL VACANCY. It was agreed to co-opt Mr. Craig Wright, who was present at the Meeting, to become a Member of the Parish Council. He was warmly welcomed, and the appropriate declaration papers were duly completed.

CORRESPONDENCE. A letter from CALC advising expected membership fees next year was received. Emails regarding the continued evolution of W.&F interaction with the Parish, were received and noted. An invitation by "Sovereign Play". To carry out a no obligation survey with respect to Newton Reigny Play Area. It was agreed to take up the offer.

PLANNING MATTERS. The Parish Council examined two applications under permitted development regulation. Regarding the construction of two covered silage pits, at Catterlen Hall Farm., and the size reduction of a proposed extension at "Dunrovin" Catterlen.

HIGHWAYS. The condition of road surfaces in the Parish, with particular reference to the persistent problem of water emission on Kiln Tofts brow, resulting in extensive break up of the tarmac structure. There were also concerns expressed with regard to lack of line markings. And lack of complete footway provision in Catterlen Village W.&F. Councillor. Colin Atkinson agreed to take up these matters with W.&F.C.C. Highways.

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LIVING IN THE COMMUNITY. The clerk presented a distillation of comments received from 16 replies. Showing concerns in the following order of magnitude
1. Speeding Traffic. 2. Road Surfaces. 3. Flooding. 4. Village Hall. 5 Broadband.
6. Play Area. 7. Planning. 8. Bus Service. 9. Catterlen Footways. 10. Dog Walking.
11. Village Events. 12. Pub Parking. 13. Air B&Bs 14. Flower Planters.
It was agreed to hold a Public Meeting after New Year, time, venue, and date will be published widely.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS. An informal discussion took place with regard to the future of the Village Hall. There being no further business to transact the Chairman closed the Meeting at 9.00 p.m.
